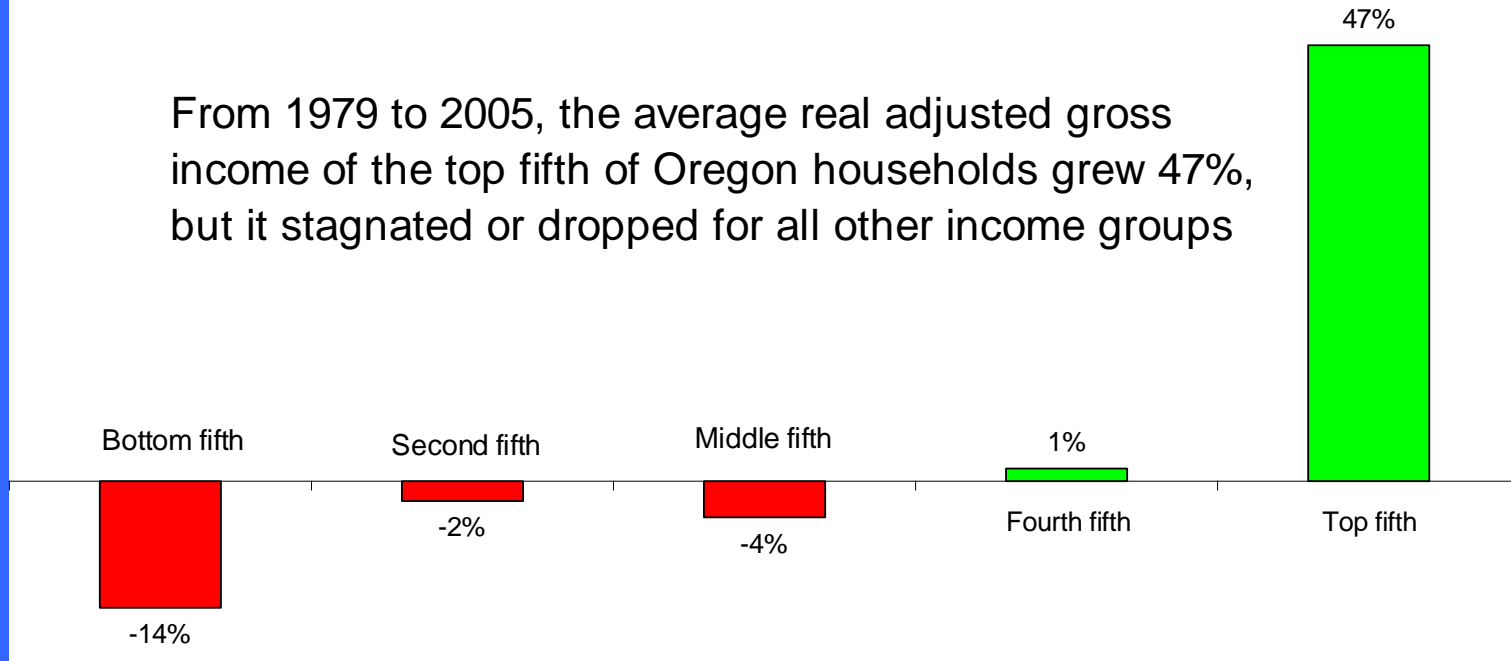


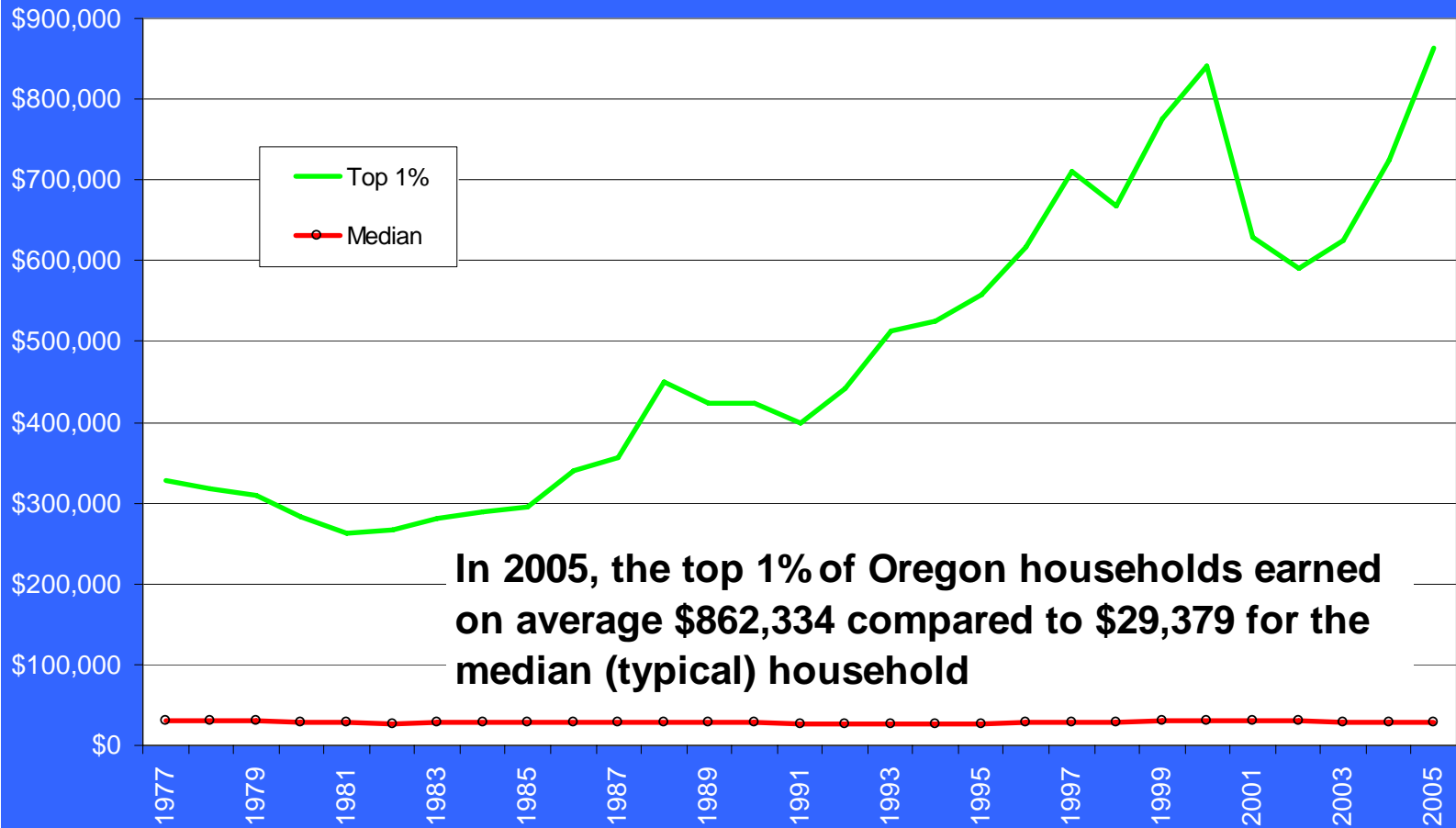
AN OREGON ECONOMY FOR THE FEW...

From 1979 to 2005, the average real adjusted gross income of the top fifth of Oregon households grew 47%, but it stagnated or dropped for all other income groups

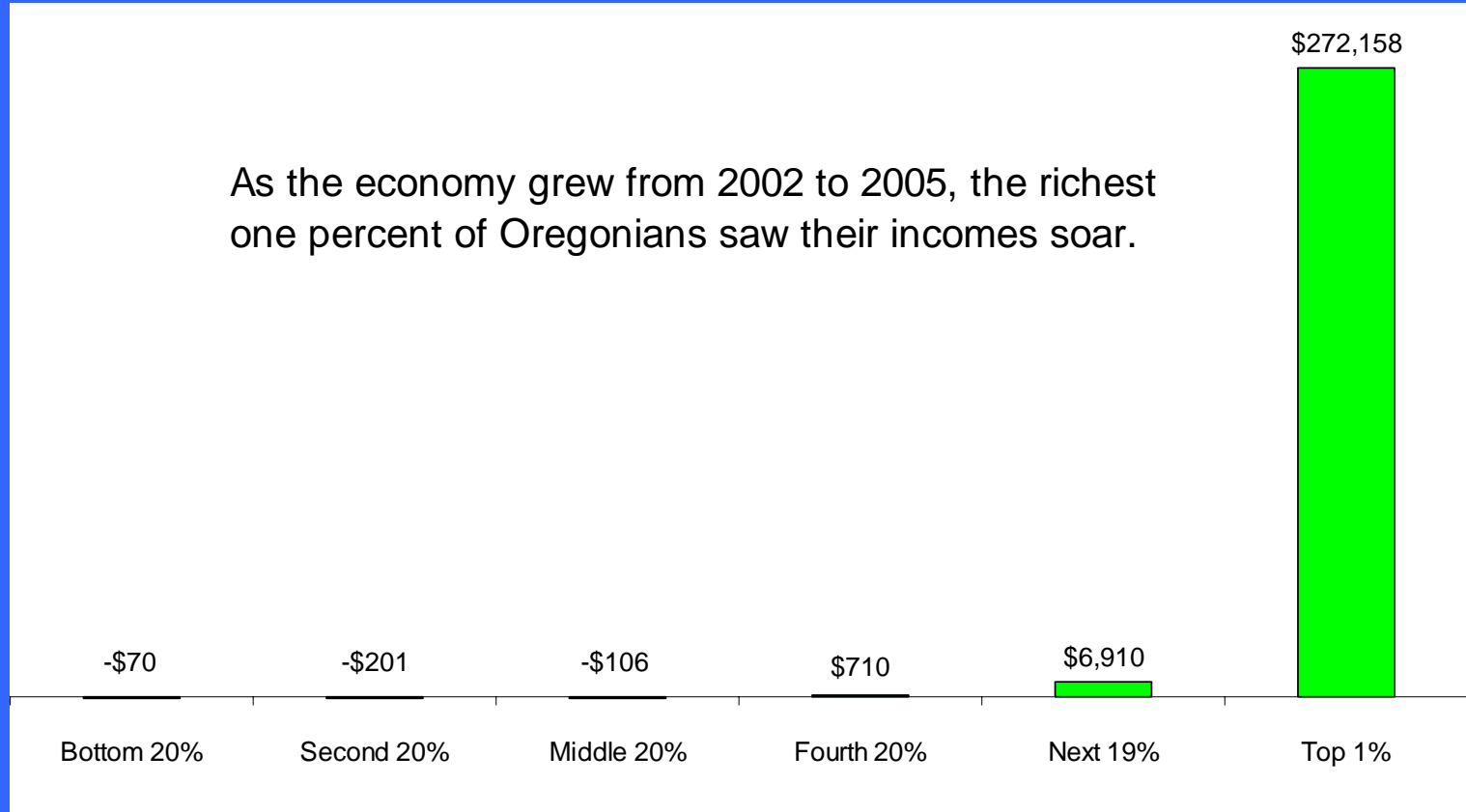
...AND FEWER STILL

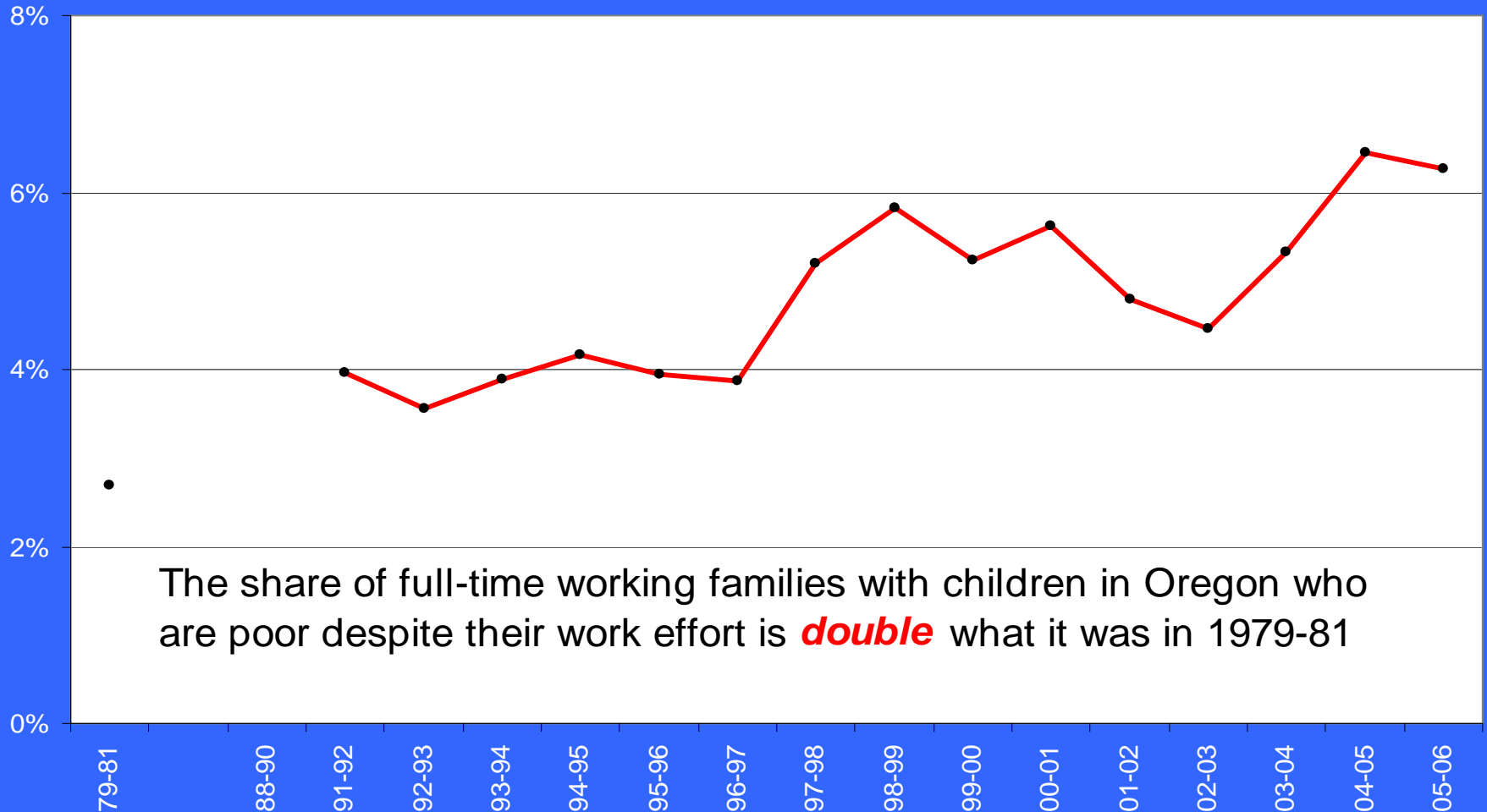
WINNER TAKES ALL

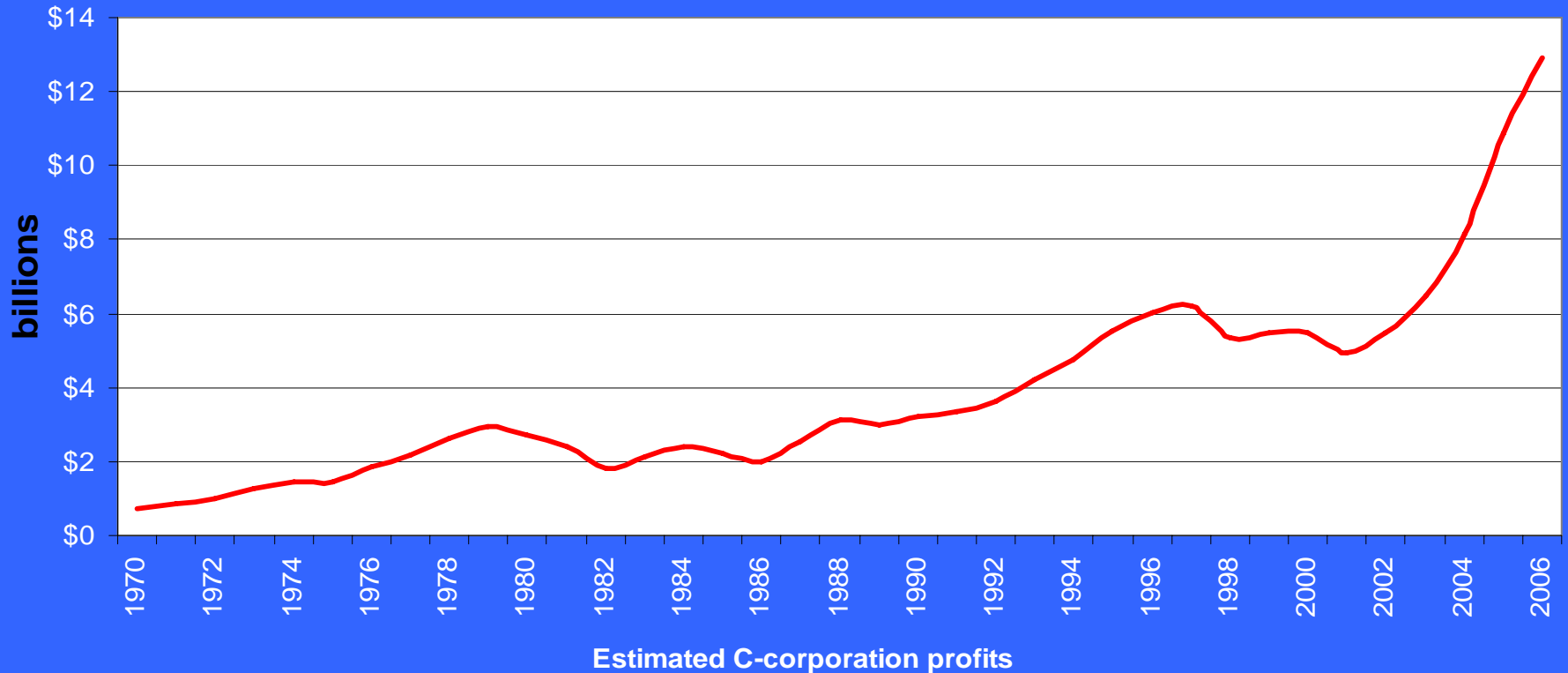
THE WORKING POOR
