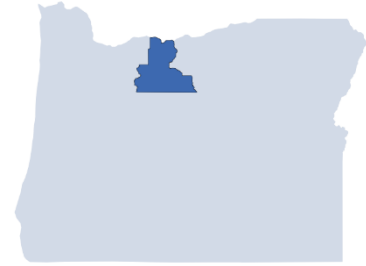




# Food Insecurity and SNAP

## Wasco County



Many people in Wasco County struggle to put food on the table. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is the nation's first line of defense against food insecurity. Efforts to weaken SNAP threaten more hardship on the people of Wasco County and the loss of millions in spending at local businesses.
