

## ATTACHMENT B

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF ACTIVITIES OREGON CENTER FOR PUBLIC POLICY 403 N. Tomahawk Island Drive Portland, OR 97217

This new organization has been formed to study and educate on human resources issues that impact the low-income, aged, disabled, and other vulnerable populations that need public assistance. OCPP plans to gather information and study the systems, programs, and populations that are part of the network that provides human services. OCPP will also test models of how the programs work in order to evaluate the effectiveness of the programs. OCPP will develop and encourage standards and outcome measures for human services programs so that the effectiveness of human services programs can be gauged.

OCPP initially plans to engage in study, analysis, and education in these areas:

1. Evaluation of State Programs. OCPP will collect and examine the financial data on tax policies and spending. It will examine the governmental agency programs and spending to analyze whether and

how effectively the spending is accomplishing the goals of the legislature. OCPP has not determined which programs it will

- initially examine, but its efforts are likely to focus on the legislative revamping of the children's services system, or on the Adult and Family Services' Jobs Plus Program. 2. Evaluation of State Tax Policies. OCPP plans to collect and
- examine financial and other data about state tax credit programs. OCPP will develop and apply performance measures and outcomes evaluations to determine if the tax eredit policies are meeting the the public legislative goals.
- 3. Education. OCPP will disseminate the results of its findings to interested state agencies and to groups working with the affected populations, such as the Oregon Alliance for the Mentally Ill and the Oregon Advocacy Center, and to the general public.

Four members of the Board of Directors for the Oregon Center for Public Policy is appointed by the Board of Directors of the Human Services Coalition of Oregon, a \$501(c)(4) organization of human services providers that provides assistance to human services providers and the populations they serve.
